INFORMATION

Tryouts: There is a two-day tryout. The *tentative* first day of tryouts will be **Monday, August 9th**. Coach Kobliska will email information regarding tryouts over the summer. Other information will also be included on the “Athletics” link of Plainfield Central’s website some time closer to the approaching date of tryouts. **ALL players must have a physical on file** (taken within the last year) **AND** a signed **Wildcat Code** completed **prior to tryouts**.

Equipment: All golfers must have their own clubs.

Dress code: Golfers should wear **PROPER ATTIRE**, which means a collared shirt, no jeans, hats should be worn forward, etc.

Team: We have 2 teams: Freshman/Sophomore golf team & a Varsity golf team. The Fresh./Soph. team will consist of 11 to 12 members. The Varsity team will consist of 9 to 10 members. There may be cuts depending on how many golfers tryout.

Season: The regular season runs from Monday, August 9th to early-October (State Finals).

Home course facility: For the past fifteen years, our varsity’s home course has been **Mistwood Golf Club** located at 1700 W. Renwick Rd., Romeoville, IL 60446. Our freshman / sophomore team practices at **Wedgewood Golf Course** located at the corner of Rt. 59 and Caton Farm Rd. Both levels play our matches at Mistwood Golf Club. Mistwood and Wedgewood have both been extremely generous in providing us time to utilize their course and other practice facilities for tournament play, match play, and practice.

Summer Camp: Dates, times, and prices have not yet been confirmed for this upcoming summer. However, we will have a free chipping & putting clinic in mid-May and then a golf camp in mid-June that will focus on all aspects of the game.
